# ARE YOU READY TO APPLY?

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- The Common Application, including the personal essay and University of Redlands questions ([www.commonapp.org](http://www.commonapp.org))
- \$30 application fee
- Official transcripts from all secondary schools attended.
  - *Freshmen*: Please submit both the official transcript and an official translation if courses are not in English
  - *Transfer*: An IERF or WES evaluation is required for coursework completed outside of the U.S.
- Two letters of recommendation, one from a college counselor (or other school official) and one from a teacher who can speak to your academic ability
- Proof of English language proficiency. Students must demonstrate adequate command of the English language to enroll at the University of Redlands (required for international students whose first language is NOT English)
- SAT or ACT (Required for international students whose first language is English)

## REQUIRED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY SCORES

If English is your first language, you must submit an SAT or ACT score. If your first language is not English, you may meet English proficiency by one of the following:

- 80 iBT/550 paper-based TOEFL
- 6.5 IELTS
- 550 SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing or 500 SAT Critical Reading
- 21 ACT English and Reading sections
- Completion of 1 college level English Composition Course from a US regionally accredited institution with a C or better (International Transfer Applicants Only)

## CONDITIONAL ADMISSION

If English language proficiency is not met, students can be awarded conditional admission. University of Redlands is pleased to partner with the Middlebury Institute of International Studies in Monterey, California to offer an Intensive English Program. Upon successful completion of your English Program, students can transition to the University of Redlands to begin their bachelor's degree.

## SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

U.S. Citizens and Permanent Residents are eligible for partial, merit-based scholarships through the University of Redlands in addition to need-based aid, as determined by the FAFSA.
